Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru 'Le Cailleret'

Winemaker Vincent Boyer is an anomaly—a hard-working, hands-in-the soil grower focused on quality in an appellation where many wineries have hired enologists and coasted on Meursault's reputation. Domaine Boyer-Martenot is a fourth-generation family winery where the wine in the bottle unquestionably lives up to its noble appellation. While most Meursault winemakers blend, Vincent bottles many of his wines from his villages-level vineyards separately. Through the efforts of this estate, these single-vineyard Meursault wines have found their voice—showing just how varied and captivating great Meursault can be.

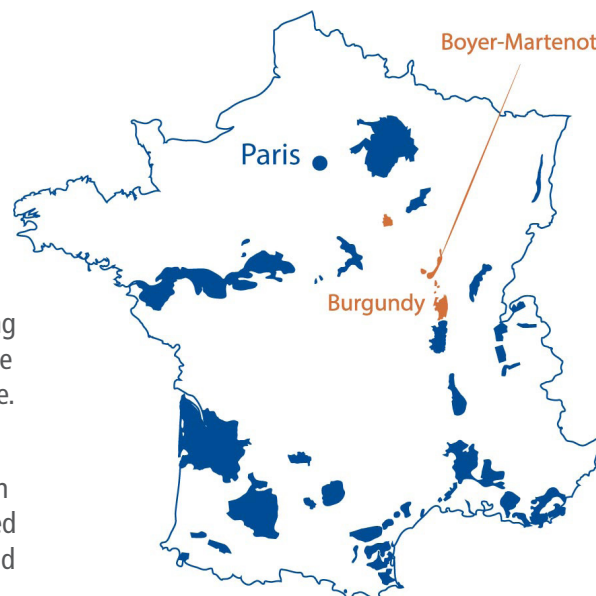
VINEYARDS: 'Le Cailleret' is Puligny's most noble premier cru, bordering grand cru Montrachet. Soils are ruddy, limestone-rich, with lots of white stones. Facing east, the plot sits between 960 and 1,020 feet in altitude.

AGE OF VINES: 30-50 years

WINEMAKING: Hand-harvested. Grapes are pressed then fermented in temperature-controlled, stainless steel tanks on indigenous yeasts. Aged in French oak barrels, with approx. 50% new wood. Bottled unfiltered and unfiltered.

TASTING IMPRESSIONS: Aromas of yellow peaches, light toast, orange zest, light herbs. Layered and complex; flavors of ripe white fruit, minerals.

PAIRING SUGGESTIONS: Freshwater fish; shellfish; ripe cheeses



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
