

BOYER DE BARVin de France Rosé 2021

Winemaker Vincent Boyer of Domaine Boyer-Martenot as of 2018 has teamed up with his childhood friend Emmanuel Lucas De Bar, who owns vineyards in the Hérault valley in France's Languedoc, to form a winemaking partnership across appellations. Organically raised and crafted with the same care as Vincent's peerless Meursault wines, these new, very limited-quantity wines combine the pleasure of the sunny south with serious Burgundian quality—and represent excellent value.

BLEND: 75% Cinsault and 25% Syrah

VINEYARDS: Estate vineyards, facing north, are located near the village of Pezenas, in the Hérault valley. Soils are rich in clay and gravel, with a moderate percentage of limestone. Vineyards are cared for according to organic principles, but are not yet certified.

AGE OF VINES: 20 years

WINEMAKING: Hand-harvested. Rosé de pressurage; juice fermented on indigenous yeasts in tank. Aged in tank.

TASTING IMPRESSIONS: Aromas of cherry, raspberry, light spice. Fresh and

juicy, with good acidic balance

PAIRING SUGGESTIONS: As an aperitif; with fresh goat's cheese; river fish
