



AZIENDA AGRICOLA VADIAPERTI

Fiano di Avellino 'Aipierti'

Since the end of the nineteenth century, the Troisi family has championed the wines of Irpinia, a historic vine-growing area in northern Campania. This ancient region is home to the white grape Fiano, a variety prized in Roman times. The family's focus on Campania's rich history of grapes is exceptional; winemaker Raffaele Troisi's father Antonio was one of the first growers to bottle a single-variety Fiano wine, while Raffaele himself was the first to bottle a single-variety Coda di Volpe. Vadiaperti's high-altitude vineyards and pure volcanic soils combine for southern Italian white wines of impeccable finesse, freshness and character.

VINEYARDS: Estate vineyards sit at 1,200 above sea level, facing south, in the regions of Vadiaperti and Montefredane. Soils are primarily clay-based. A selection of the estate's oldest, and lowest-yielding, vines.

AGE OF VINES: 40 years

WINEMAKING: Hand-harvested. Full-cluster press; fermented on indigenous yeasts in temperature-controlled tanks. Aged in tank on fine lees for up to two years.

TASTING IMPRESSIONS: Aromas of smoke, pear and flowers. Weighty and concentrated; a long finish. Great cellar potential.

PAIRING SUGGESTIONS: Rich seafood; burrata; fresh lobster in cream

NOTES: 'Aipierti' is dialect for the region surrounding Montefredane; the name 'Vadiaperti' is its modern Italian equivalent. Vadiaperti means "open passages."



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
